Fred Barker 19 HISTORICAL OR ARCHITECTURAL IMPORTANCE					
Originally on this site stood a blacksmith's shop built by Newton Stent who followed that trade until his death. (1) Not buried in town. (2) That building stood closer to the present Foxon Road in what is now the front parking area. The store was built and first owned by Mr. Fred Barker, contractor, who lived in the bungalow next door, #243 Foxon Rd., which he also built. Operated by Mrs. Barker, the store originally had a porch and gas pumps at the front. SIGNIFICANCE	According to a previous owner (Mrs. Charles Brennan) who purchased it in 1948, there were tales that during Prohibition the house was a speakeasy and whorehouse. At that time it was very isolated, the only house on a road that went over Totoket Mountain near Lane's Pond. The only survivor of a number of houses built by the Fowler family in the "White Hollow" area which until about 1890 was part of Guilford.
