## TRANSCRIPTION SELECTMEN'S REPORT OCTOBER 7th 1833 TOWN OF NORTH BRANFORD Accession Number 1974-003-001

#### Physical Description:

This report appears to be the first annual report issued after the establishment of North Branford as a separate town. The report is written in black ink, in a fine clear hand, in a hand-sewn booklet. It is composed of four sheets of writing paper, 16" wide by 6.5" high plus a coarse brown cover sheet which is approximately one inch larger all around. The sheets are folded and sewn down the fold to produce a booklet with 16 pages 8" wide by 6.5" high with front and back covers.

The booklet is in generally good condition except that there is mice damage in the lower left and upper right corners. Fortunately the missing areas fall mostly in the margins. However, some text has been lost. Areas of missing text are shown within brackets, (). Some of the missing text can be guessed at with fairly high certainty either because only part of a word is missing or because a missing number is provided somewhere else in the text. Text provided in this manner is shown within brackets. Questionable readings are followed by a question mark. Illegible words are shown by a series of x's. Fortunately there are few of these as the text is generally quite clear and easy to read.

The format of the original is followed in the transcription so that the number of lines and pages is the same. The spelling and punctuation of the original are also retained. For clarity, page numbers are shown in brackets although there are no page numbers in the original.

In the sections related to aid to the poor, family names have been omitted in the transcription in order to respect the privacy of the families involved.
