Mr. Spencer comes home with me &c.

Fri 8 March 1822. Cooler -- Snowy some squally &c. I Attend Singing Meeting at Mr. Merricks few there, &c.

Sat 9 Cooler &c. - I make a bamboo Chair &c. -- Theis Evening I attend Our prayer Meet. at S. Alden. I take a part &c.

Sab 10th. pleasant -- cooler some I attend Meet Text from Matthew 6th Chap. 9th - 13 V. The Lords prayer -- The text dwelt upon all day -- good Sermon Oh. how stupid are Christians! -- May I be brought to (counteract?) the (?trictions?) of Sinners This Evening I attend Singing Meet. Mr. Spencer not here -- at home -- This Evening after returning from Singing Meeting with Surprise I received Information that William had been published and was immediately to

be married -- The ceremony was (past?) after being held in contemplations between the parties perhaps 6 years, I with a few, was present to witness the ceremony -- pleasant Evening Moon light -- Retire about 12 Oclock

Mon 11 March 1822. Coot -- William A Reynolds this morning moves his wife and commences keeping House! I enjoy myself very well -- Library Meet. --

Tues 12. Cloudy some -- Clear Spring wether -- ground settles This Evening I attend a Meet. at Mr Merricks, take an active part &c. -- Walk with Cynthia Baldwin

Wen. 13. Cool windy Wether Healthy in this place indeed But religion low! I attend with Cynthia Baldwin a Religious Meet, in the Upper School House good Meet, but Windy Wether - Conversed with Cynthia upon

Religion much -- well pleased

<u>Thur. 14 March 1822</u>. Cold windy & tedious -- March Wether I work little -- This Evening I attend Singing Meet. but Mr Spencer absent -- Disappointment

Fri 15 Windy yet &c. I go to New Haven in Chair purchase a vest handkerchief & other whites &c. attend Singing School this Evening but Mr Spencer absent -- after ten retire! and my God in mercy protect me & spare my life my health (& come?) this nights rest to vanish (??) then my feeble frame! for Christs sake Amen. --

Sat 16 Dul Cloudy &c. -- William bought Chair plank of Capt. Rose etc -- This Evening I attend the prayer Meet. take a part &c. at M. Fords --

Sab 17th March 1822 pleasant I with Frederick M. attend Meet. in North Guilford – Mr. Witmore first Sermon from Luke 13 Chap. 5th Verse "I tell you nay &c." afternoons discourse from Matthew 7 Chap. 13 & 14 V. - "Because short is the gate &c." good preaching -- Dine at Mr. Richard Fowlers -- Return home after Meet. Mr. Atwater first discouse upon prayer &c. 2nd upon Universal salvation -- I attend Sining (sic) this Evening -- M. Spencer present -- good sining (sic) --

Mon 18. I work some &c. I prick offnotes for Spencer &c. This Evening Sarah Merrick visit William I flute with her. This day Mary Palmer 20 years old -- pleasant Spring day --

Tues. 19. holds pleasant -- This Evening I walk out

Wen. 20 March. 1822 I set up Bamboo Chairs &c. -- pleasant -- I attend a Meet, this Evening in School House -'Oh think my Soul, think of the conditions in which those fallen! Mr Witmore preach'd first discourse from lst Peter 4 Chap clause of the 19th Verse "What Shall the end be of them &c." afternoon text from 2nd Peter 3rd Chap. lith Verse "Seeing then that all there &c." Oh! how Solemn how deeply

interesting! The Solemnity of the discourse together with the shocking instance of mortality which has this day taken place can not fail of making an impression upon my mind. Solemn day! a day on which the immortal part of one whose face has for many years been familliar to me & who but a few days since enjoyed health & could look forward with as good a prospect oflong life as others is now in Eternity! now made acquainted with the realities of the (?) World! Oh! how interessting and solem must be the Change — Great God! prepare this unworthy servant for this Solemn Event! for the interesting change which must soon take place Oh! may I ever keep in view my (??) I attend the Lecture preparatory -Mr. Wetmore preach from these words containd in Epesians 1st Chap. 5 Verse. - "Having (predestined?) us into the adoption of children" -- After services the Church (voted? to the choice of Deacons or assistant Deacons -- Mr. Daniel Whedon and Mr. Alden was chosen -- unanimously

Sab 5 Rainy morning -- I attend meet. Communion day -- A kind Providence has again permitted me an unworthy being to come around

the table of a Dying Saviour -- Oh! how thankful ought I to be - Sermon from St. John 19 Chap. 30 Verse -- "He said it is finish'd" -- 2nd Discourse from Nehemiah 4 Chap. 16, 17, & 18 V. "and it comes to pass &c." good Sermon -- Meet. appointed this Evening I not attend -- Cool --

Man 6 May 1822 Cool day Training at Northford -- I not there -- My health not good -- A forward Season -- Pair tree blows out. and Apple Blossoms begin to show -- much grass and a prospect of a plentiful season I set up Chairs -- Work enough --

Tues 7. rather Cloudy -- Cool. I work at Chairs &c. Sisters recover from the measles -- Prayer meet this Evening

Wen 8 pleasant Wether -- beautiful Season

I paint &c. -- trees beautiful --

Thurs 9 May 1822 Cool growing season -- pulpit (quishon?) made

Fri 10 Some want of rain -- The measles about yet &c. I plant some &c. --

Sat 11 I paint &c. pleasant Apples blossoming out -- A great prospect of apples --

Sab 12 I attend Meeting – Mr Gillet preach'd - from Romans 6 Chap 14 & 15 Verses "For sin shall not &c." Very Interesting Sermon Ezekiel lith 19th "and I will take the stony heart &c." good preaching and pleasant day -- Miss Rebecca Robinson publish'd -- I attend the Meet. this Evening &c. --

Mon 13. pleasant day. I paint William Reynolds takes an apprentice Nicolas Sheldon=-

Tues. 14 May. 1822 Wann spring day -- fruit trees in full bloom I ornament Chairs--

Wen. 15 Dry Wether -- pleasant I work at Chairs &c. -- unwell --

Thurs. 16 healthy time now - a small shower of rain -

Fri. 17 1822 William to N. Haven I ornament Chairs — Some Cloudy cool. Some drops of rain — I am 22. years Of age this day." Measure in height Five feet 8 inches and weigh 126 pound — weigh'd June 25. 1822 Through the unspeakable goodness of God this day returns which adds another year to those gone beyond the flood — Should God continue me to behold the same number of years which I (Jesus?) lived I then should be 42 yrs of age — Life tis but span! In reviewing the past year which appears but a few days I find that

numbers have taken by Death some with whom I was intimately acquainted — My life has not only been (spanded?) but I have been a rich partaker of the blessing & comforts oflife — Oh how unspeakable indebted am I to the great author of my existance!! &c. My mind I do not enjoy this day on account of being so mixed with this vain world — Man too worldly minded to enjoy Religion — Great God! wean me from this World and grant me longing desires after holiness for Christs sake, Amen —

Sat 18. May 1822 pleasant day I bottom Chairs &c. - Thunder rain this Evening -

was truly shocking -- about 5 Oclock I was called upon and for what to see him a corpse who but a few minutes before I had been conversing with & who apparently though little of Death so near -- The Jury of inquest was of oppinion the death was occasion'd from a fall from a rail lying across the River upon which he was attempting to walk -- that his bead from a bruise which appear'd upon the side struck a stone which stunn'd him. and by being in the water strangled and died -- This however is hardly my oppinion -- It appeard more from circumstances, that he was taken faint or by a fit which accasion'd his fall -- How shock'd was I upon being the first to remove the body from the water which tho shallow was running over

his face and body — thus to find him whose face I have so many times beheld & particularly the last 6 months excited feelings which can hardly be described — I set up with the corpse —

Wen 10. Noy 1824. Clears off -- very pleasant -- the funeral of J. Harrison attended about 3 Oclock many people present -- solemn time indeed -- I feel pecularily admonish'd be this providence -- Sleep this night in the house also

Thur. 11. Clear pleasant -- cool -- Oh what a vacancy in the neighborhood -- alas he's gone!!

Fri 12 I work in the shop some Yesterday paint at N. Roses -- Oh how important to be prepared for Death -- Oh God so prepare me that when call'd I be in Readiness -- Sleep with the afflicted family --

Sat 13 pleasant cool day -- I feel gloomy -- paint work in shop --

Oh how frequently reminded even by the crowing of the cock & thousands of circumstances of my departed neighbor -- sleep with John Harrison also tonight --

Sab 14 Noy 1824 cool Wether for November -- the mourning request prayers -- text in 55th Chap. Isaiah 6th V. "Seek ye the Lord &c." -- afternoon text in 2nd Timothy 4th Chap 1 & 2nd V. "I charge thee therefore &c." good preaching I attend the Evening Meeting --

Mon 15. Pleasant then Cloudy some -- I work in shop --

Tues 16. Cloudy Rainy day Very muddy I work at chairs Sleep with J. Harrison &c.

Wen 17 Cloudy get muddy

Thur 18 Clears off -- I go carry Doct. Lays carpet home &c. -- Cold -- Winter wether --
